## Minutes

### Tax Distribution Formula Review

Definitions:

- Values - the why- criteria

- Equity – similar to viability. Sense of proportionality.
- Transparency – In the agreement, everyone knows the formula
- Consistency/Replicable – any person will get the same result using the formula

What values does the Board want to guide how tax dollars are distributed?

- Equity – Make sure each library has the bare minimum to be a library. The per capita guide shows the equity: small libraries will have a larger per capita number.
- Consistency
- Objective criteria – Board is authority and may not always be completely objective
- Replicable
- Sustainability
- Transparency
- Viability – bare minimum level to function, to provide a salary to attract employees.
- Formula that would not build competition into the criteria
- Focus on the library district as a system
- Keep the role of the Board and Director – neutral
- KISS – Keep It Simple Sweetie

Factors/Elements to Consider in Formula

- Population –
  - Zip Code
  - Service Population –  $\text{City Population} / \text{Total of all Cities Populations} = \text{Multiplier}$   
 $\% \times \text{Unincorporated Population total} + \text{City Population}$
- Base Amount –
  - Look at current operations – what are operation budgets
  - What are current FTEs?
  - Budgets – proportional
  - Run formula with base amount only for UCSLD partner libraries and with base amount including Hermiston
- Compliance with State Rules and OLA Guidelines – do not include in formula, but in Agreements
- Original funding was based on threshold criteria – how was the dollar amount determined?

## Electronic Databases

The Board explored the available, Statewide databases, including the LearningExpress Library.
